

Anheuser-Busch Wholesalers in Arizona promoted the We I.D. Program with more than 3,300 RETAILERS in their markets during 2020.






In 2020, EIGHT A-B **WHOLESALERS** in Arizona promoted the Family Talk About Drinking program with organizations such as schools and parent groups.

COLLEGE SNAPSHOT

The percentage of college students who had five or more drinks in a row in the past two weeks (33%) is DOWN 28% from its peak in 1984.3

The percentage of college freshmen who drink beer frequently (3.6%) is DOWN 85% from its peak in 1981.8

A-B Wholesalers supported Safe-Ride Home programs in Arizona by providing more than 75,600 SAFE RIDES home from bars and restaurants since 1989.





MOST ALCOHOL-IMPAIRED DRIVING FATALITIES INVOLVE HIGH-BAC DRIVERS4




ALCOHOL-IMPAIRED DRIVING FATALITIES DOWN LONG-TERM⁴
